## Welcome & Call to Order

#### Minutes

#### **Financials**

- **FY24 Audit Presentation:** Cheri Amos, Aires Coleman, and Max Pfaffenberger of CliftonLarsonAllen, LLP presented the PPIC's FY24 Financial Audit Report.
- Quarterly Financial Report: Kyera Pope, Controller with the City of Portsmouth Finance Department, presented the PPIC's Quarterly Financial Report through December 31, 2024.

## **Old Business**

- Port of Virginia Update: Mr. Chris Gullickson of the Port of Virginia provided an update on the Port's activities stating that there was an increase in growth of approximately 7.2% in calendar year 2024 and that there are four new ship-to-shore cranes at Virginia International Gateway currently going through the commissioning process. Mr. Peter Hansen, Commissioner, reported that the Coastal Virginia Offshore Wind project being staged from the Portsmouth Marine Terminal is currently on schedule.
- **O Sixth Street, 1603 Seventh Street:** Mr. Donahue reported that the property at O Sixth Street and 1603 Seventh Street is in the process of being transferred from the PRHA to the PPIC after which marketing for redevelopment can begin.
- FY25 Port Host Community Grant 1040 Virginia Ave: Mr. Donahue reported that a Port Host Community Grant was awarded in the amount of \$800,000 for the Norfolk Portsmouth Belt Line Railroad Project at 1040 Virginia Ave. The project is scheduled to be completed 18 months from the next step, the Performance Agreement.

#### **New Business**

- CSX/DeLong Rail Transloading Facility 1 Harper Ave: Mr. Donahue reported that the
  Delong Co. will pursue a DRPT Rail Industrial Grant in the amount of \$750,000 for a Rail
  Transloading Facility at 1 Harper Ave.
- FY26 PPIC Budget Committee: Ms. Allen reported that members of the PPIC's FY26
  Budget Committee will be selected to assist in the preparation of the upcoming fiscal
  year budget.
- City Council/PPIC Joint Meeting July 7, 2025: Mr. Donahue reported that the City Council has requested a joint meeting to be held with the PPIC on July 7, 2025 at 5:30pm to discuss activities and collaboration.
- **PPIC Annual Retreat:** Ms. Allen reported that a poll will be sent out to PPIC members to identify a date for the PPIC's Annual Retreat.
